FEBRUARY 2010 GAMES PERIOD DELIVERY PROGRAM - SUMMARY

The Resort Municipality of Whistler and its transportation partners' have prepared an Olympic Winter Games integrated transportation plan. This plan has identified the management of vehicular traffic on both municipal roads and Highway 99 to be a priority. Critical to this objective is the need to manage delivery vehicles within the RMOW during peak times. In order to ensure our success the RMOW is developing a February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program which will address the supply and delivery of goods to commercial businesses. The following is a summary of key points as related to this program:

1. The February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program is not a security initiative it is a traffic management initiative to manage delivery vehicles on municipal roads and Highway 99 during peak times;
2. The February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program will be in effect February 1 through February 28, 2010;
3. Vehicle delivery hours under the February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program vary depending on location. Delivery schedule is as follows:
 - Whistler Village & Upper Village
 - 12:00am – 6:00am
 - Creekside and all other areas of the Municipality
 - 10:00pm – 6:00am
 - Function Junction will remain unrestricted.

In addition to the February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program, the RMOW is developing a Games Period Quick Delivery Program which will allow for limited peak time deliveries, subject to additional conditions.

4. The February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program time restriction is applicable whether a delivery is being made using the public road allowance or private loading facilities;
5. The RMOW suggests that suppliers/distributors consider assigning additional staff to delivery vehicles to maximize delivery efficiency;
6. During the specified hours of the February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program there will be no restrictions on the size of delivery vehicle utilized by suppliers/distributors;
7. Suppliers/distributors will not require a specific permit when making deliveries during the February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program. The Games Period Quick Delivery Program will be permitted;
8. Through traffic on Highway 99 outside of the February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program will be permitted. Vehicles traveling north of Squamish from February 11 through February 28, 2010 between the hours of 6:00am and 6:00pm are required to display valid Sea-to-Sky Checkpoint Permit;

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9. Any delivery to a Games venue or behind a Vancouver 2010 Integrated Security Unit checkpoint will need to be coordinated with and identified on VANOC's master delivery schedule; and
10. To ensure compliance with the February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program, municipal bylaws are being revised to reflect delivery regulations across the municipality. Delivery vehicles found to be in violation of municipal bylaws will be subject to ticketing and towing.

GAMES PERIOD QUICK DELIVERY PROGRAM

The RMOW recognizes the need for businesses to receive deliveries during peak times, and as such is developing a Games Period Quick Delivery Program. This program will manage delivery vehicle background traffic in critical areas of the municipality during peak times, while ensuring businesses have access to deliveries during regular business hours.

1. The Games Period Quick Delivery Program is not a security initiative it is a traffic management initiative to manage delivery vehicles on municipal roads and Highway 99 during peak times.
2. The Games Period Quick Delivery Program will be in effect February 1 through February 28, 2010.
3. The Games Period Quick Delivery Program will be administered through a permitting process. Any vehicle making deliveries under the program will be required to display a valid Quick Delivery Permit. Permits will be issued at no cost to qualified suppliers/distributors and the permits will be fully transferrable.
4. Suppliers\distributors can request a Quick Delivery Permit from the Whistler Permit Office which will be located at Municipal Hall (4325 Blackcomb Way) December 14 to February 11; Monday through Saturday, 8:30am to 4:30pm and February 12 to February 28; 7 days a week, 8:30am to 4:30pm.
5. Existing RMOW Commercial Parking Decals will not be valid as a Quick Delivery Permit while the Games Period Quick Delivery Program is in effect.
6. The maximum delivery vehicle size permitted under the Games Period Quick Delivery Program is a 16 foot long cube van or 16 foot long box truck. Note that this maximum dimension is the vehicle cargo bed length and is not inclusive of the cabin. Oversized vehicles will be ticketed and/or towed without delay.
7. Vehicle delivery hours under the Games Period Quick Delivery Program vary depending on location. Delivery schedule is as follows:
 - Whistler Village & Upper Village
 - 12:00pm – 3:00pm
 - Whistler Creek
 - 4:00pm – 10:00pm

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For all other areas of the municipality there will be no Games Period Quick Delivery Program time restrictions.

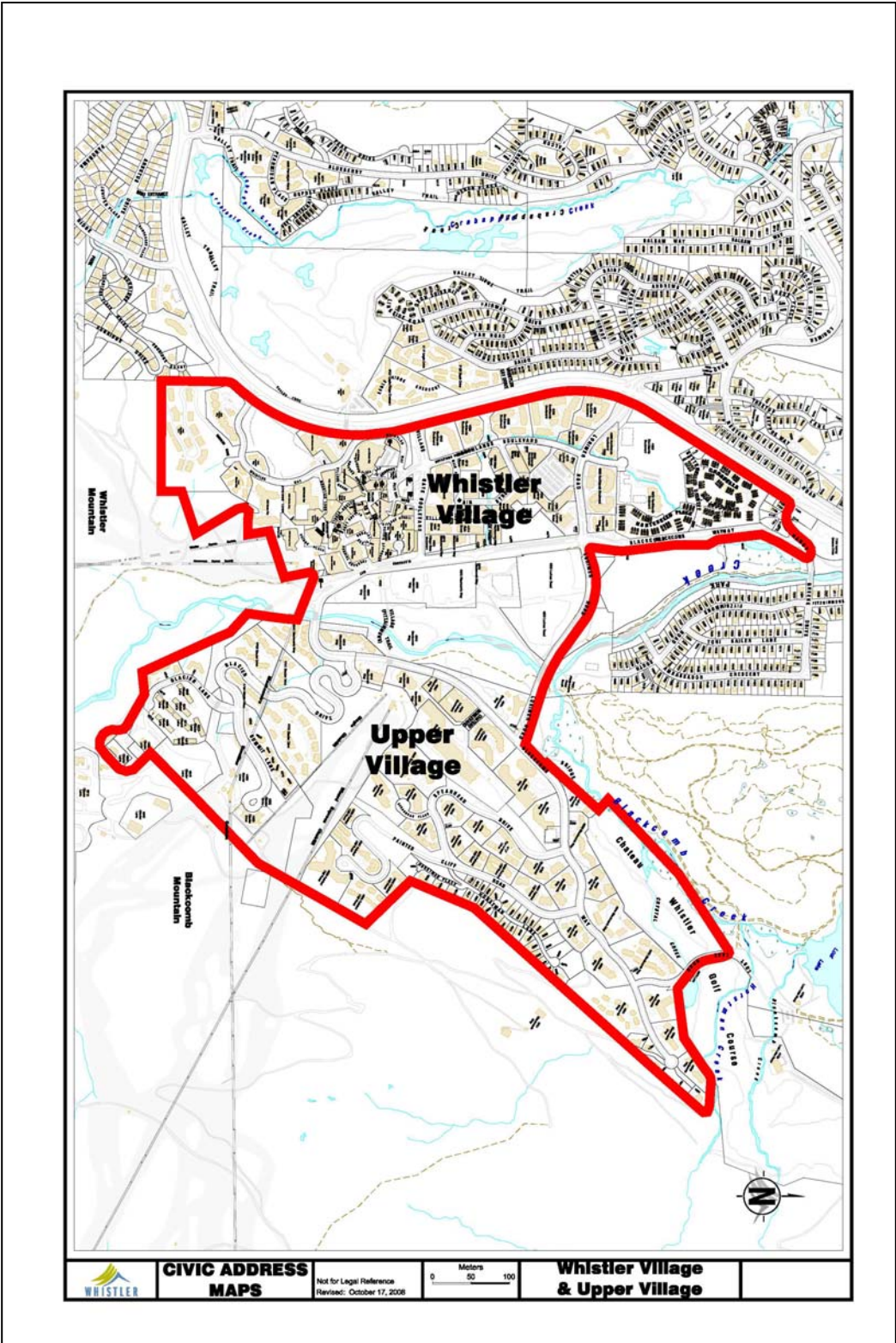
8. The Village & Upper Village quick delivery 3:00pm end time is the deadline for getting deliveries complete, not the deadline for getting deliveries started. Any supplier/distributor that has not completed their deliveries by the end of the quick delivery period will have to return to complete deliveries during the off-hour delivery period.
9. Designated public quick delivery zones will be established by the RMOW for the purpose of the Games Period Quick Delivery Program. Public quick delivery zones will be clearly identified with signage.
10. Suppliers/distributors using private loading facilities and private property for deliveries are subject to receiving the owner's permission in advance. The RMOW would encourage such shared usage of these private facilities if agreements can be worked out by the relevant parties in advance.
11. If suppliers/distributors are delivering in an area of the municipality where there are no designated public quick delivery zones within the public road allowance, the delivery vehicle must park on private property; loading/unloading within the public road allowance will be permitted in designated quick delivery zones only.
12. Suppliers/distributors with access to and when using private facilities must park their vehicle wholly within the limits of the private property. Encroaching over the sidewalk and/or road will not be permitted.
13. The maximum time a vehicle can be parked in a public quick delivery zone is 15 minutes. The RMOW suggests that suppliers/distributors consider assigning additional staff to delivery vehicles to maximize delivery efficiency. Suppliers/distributors shall only park in a public quick delivery zone when a delivery is actively in progress.
14. There will be no booking system for public quick delivery zones; they will be available on a 'first come first served' basis only. Queuing of delivery vehicles on public roads will not be permitted.
15. To ensure compliance with the Games Period Quick Delivery Program, municipal bylaws are being revised to reflect delivery regulations across the municipality. Delivery vehicles found to be in violation of municipal bylaws will be subject to ticketing and towing.
16. Vehicles will require a Localized Vehicle Permit to access Localized Vehicle Permit areas. In addition, if traveling north of Squamish from February 11 through February 28, 2010 between the hours of 6:00am and 6:00pm vehicles are required to display a valid Sea-to-Sky Checkpoint Permit.

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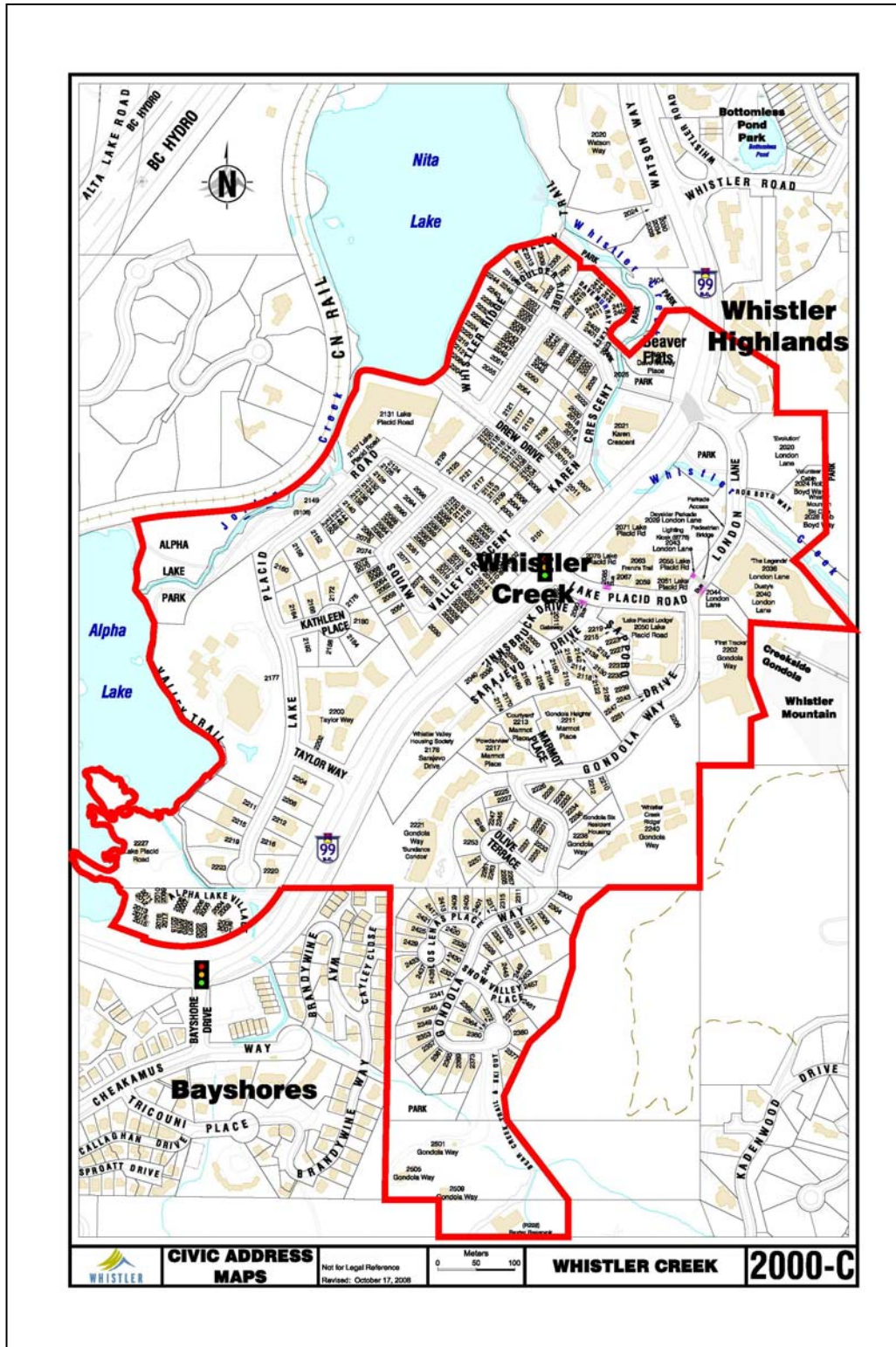
ARMoured CARS AND SMALL COURIERS

1. Armoured cars are exempt from the permit, delivery time, and vehicle size requirements identified in the February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program and the Games Period Quick Delivery Program, provided the vehicle is actively engaged in company business.
2. Small couriers are exempt from the permit and delivery time requirements identified in the February 2010 Games Period Delivery Program and the Games Period Quick Delivery Program provided the vehicle is actively engaged in company business, subject to the following:
 - i. maximum vehicle size is a 23 foot long (bumper-to-bumper) walk-in van; and
 - ii. the vehicle is insured with a valid commercial use vehicle insurance policy; and
 - iii. only non-palletized 'express' cargo (i.e. loose parcels, packages, and envelopes) is being delivered; and
 - iv. a maximum of three (3) parcels are being delivered per customer; and
 - v. the maximum weight of any parcel being delivered is 66lbs (33kg).
3. Armoured cars and small couriers are required to park in designated quick delivery zones (maximum 15 minutes) otherwise they need to secure other parking arrangements (private property). In the event any of these requirements cannot be satisfied, the pick-up\delivery will have to be made under the Quick Delivery Program and is subject to all requirements thereof.

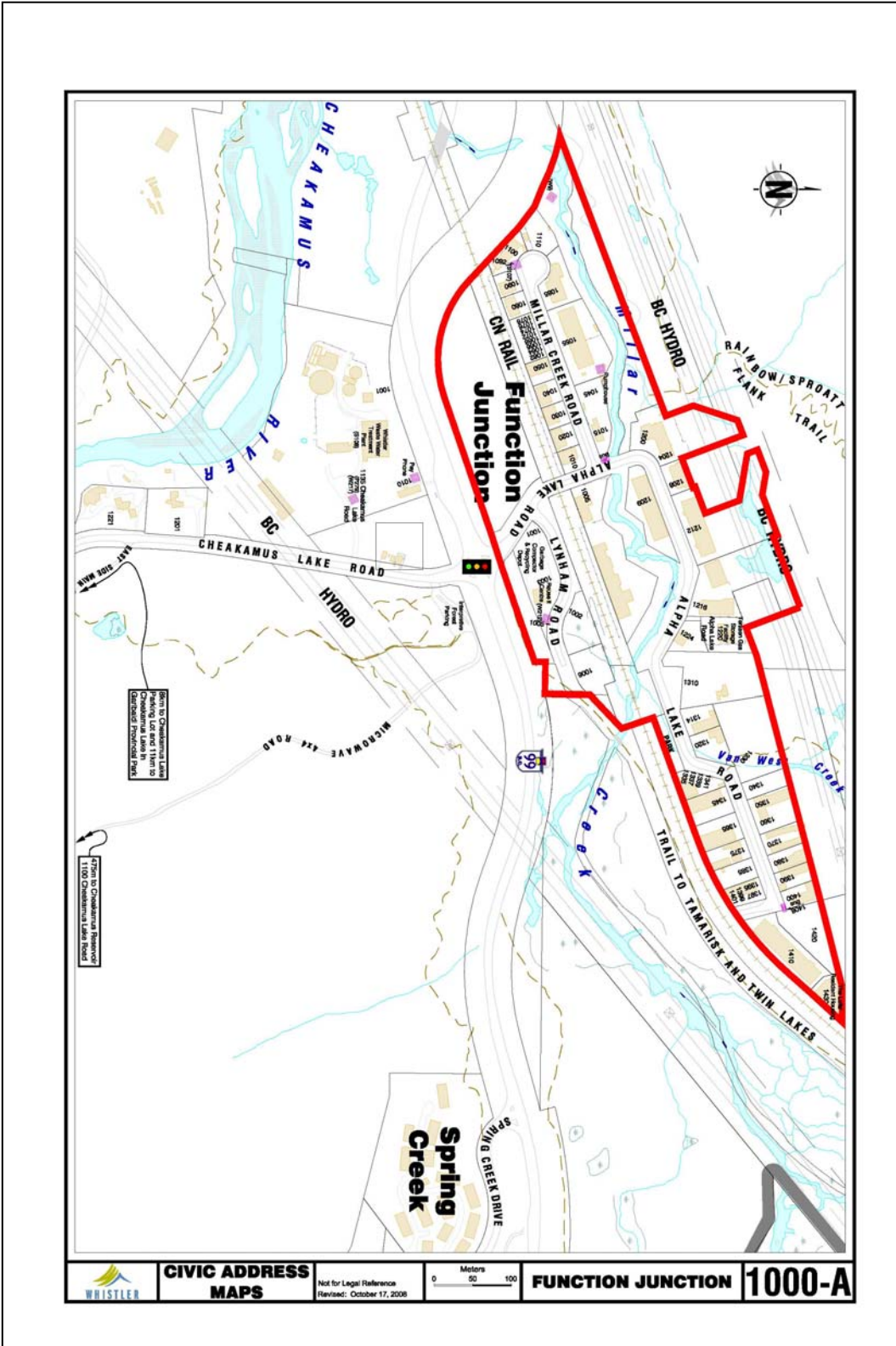
FEBRUARY 2010 GAMES PERIOD DELIVERY PROGRAM – MAP 1
